A Note from Bishop Soto:

CALIFORNIA BISHOPS URGE

RESPECT AND CALM DURING ELECTION SEASON

Bishop Jaime Soto, President of the California Catholic Conference, issued the following statement on behalf of his fellow Bishops in California:

Animosity and hyperbole has characterized the current election season. This should give all people pause. The natural and healthy exchange of ideas, critical to our democratic system has devolved into anger, intolerance and increasing alienation.

This current polarization hampers the advancement of the common good, which is one of the ultimate goals of all prudent governance. The common good – “the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily” (*Gaudium et Spes*, 26.) – requires cooperation and mutual respect. It requires that all be given the opportunity to participate in civic activities and partake in the benefits of our society.

Just a little more than one year ago, in his historic address to the U.S. Congress, Pope Francis reminded us that the Golden Rule applies in political discourse, as well as in our daily life: “This Rule points us in a clear direction. Let us treat others with the same passion and compassion with which we want to be treated. Let us seek for others the same possibilities which we seek for ourselves. Let us help others to grow, as we would like to be helped ourselves. In a word, if we want security, let us give security; if we want life, let us give life; if we want opportunities, let us provide opportunities. The yardstick we use for others will be the yardstick which time will use for us. The Golden Rule also reminds us of our responsibility to protect and defend human life at every stage of its development.”

As we approach the 240th anniversary of our Republic, we remain a resilient people, with a robust system of law and deeply held religious convictions. As the Bishops of California who are pastors of our respective local Churches, we believe in the strength of our democracy, the ultimate decency of our people, and the persuasive power of the Christian faith. Pope Francis reminded us in his address “the challenges facing us today call for a renewal of that spirit of cooperation, which has accomplished so much good throughout the history of the United States.” The contentious campaigns have wearied and worried us. The more urgent civic endeavor of forging a stronger union, ensuring domestic as well as global tranquility, and establishing justice for all is still before us. This is the common cause and our sacred duty and mission as the disciples of Jesus.

We invite all people to conscientiously participate with dignity, civility and respect for others. This may indeed be the “narrow gate” of the Gospel of this past Wednesday, October 20, but let us do so with constant prayer, and to place our faith in Him who is our hope and our salvation.

DEDICACIÓN DE LA BASÍLICA DE SAN JUAN DE LETRÁN NOVIEMBRE 09

Basílica significa: "Casa del Rey". En la Iglesia Católica se le da el nombre de Basílica a ciertos templos más famosos que los demás. Solamente se puede llamar así a los que el Sumo Pontífice les concede ese honor especial. En cada país hay algunos.



La primera Basílica que hubo en la religión Católica, fue la de Letrán, cuya consagración celebramos en este día. Era un palacio que pertenecía a una familia de nombre Letrán.

El emperador Constantino, primer gobernante romano que concedió a los cristianos el permiso para construir templos, le regaló al Sumo Pontífice el Palacio Basílica de Letrán. El Papa San Silvestro lo convirtió en templo y lo consagró el 9 de noviembre del año 324.

Esta Basílica es la Catedral del Papa y la más antigua de todas las basílicas de la Iglesia Católica. En su frontis tiene esta leyenda: "Madre y Cabeza de todas las iglesias de la ciudad y del mundo".

Se le llama Basílica del Divino Salvador, porque cuando fue nuevamente consagrada en el año 787, una imagen del Divino Salvador, al ser golpeada por un judío, derramó sangre. En recuerdo de ese hecho se le puso el nuevo nombre.

Se le denomina también Basílica de San Juan de Letrán, porque tiene dos capillas, dedicadas, la una a San Juan Bautista y la otra a San Juan Evangelista, siendo atendida por los sacerdotes de la Parroquia de San Juan.

Durante mil años, desde el año 324 hasta el 1400, -época en que los Papas se fueron a vivir a Avignon, Francia-, la casa contigua a la Basílica, que se llamó "Palacio de Letrán", fue la residencia de los Pontífices.

Allí se celebraron cinco Concilios, o reuniones de los Obispos de todo el mundo. En este palacio se firmó en 1929, el tratado de paz entre el Vaticano y el gobierno de Italia, Tratado de Letrán.

Cuando los Papas volvieron de Avignon, se trasladaron a vivir al Vaticano. Ahora, en el Palacio de Letrán, reside el Vicario de Roma, o sea el Cardenal al cual el Sumo Pontífice encarga de gobernar la Iglesia de esa ciudad.
